where you will find walk updates and a wider selection of walking routes in the Borough of Waltham Forest with information about local history and interesting buildings.

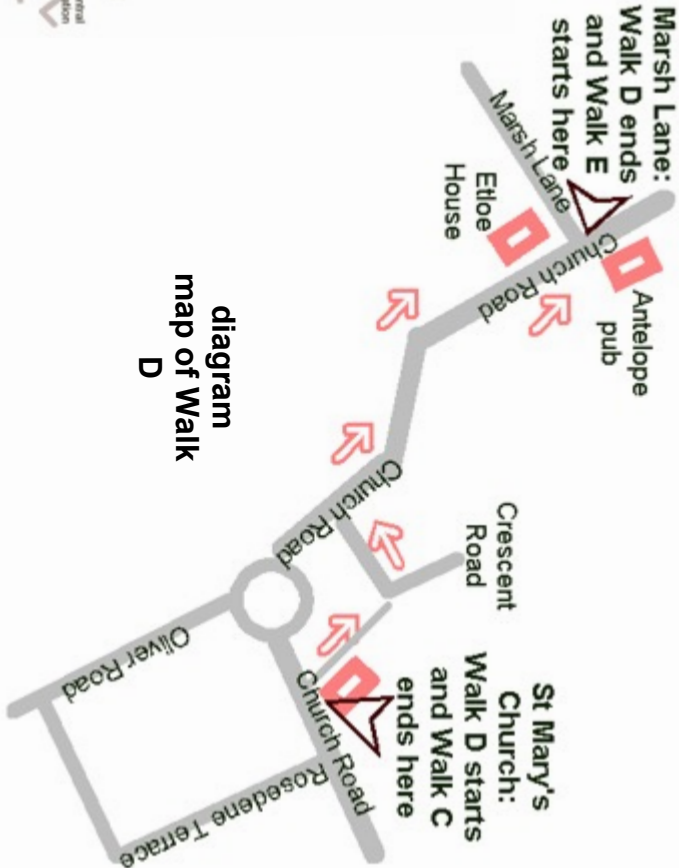

from St Mary's Churchyard to Marsh Lane
(a short, easy walk of 1/2 mile / 3/5 kilometre)

Buses 58 and 158 pass St Mary's Church, Church Road

Walk D comes to St Mary's from Leyton Youth Centre and Walnut Tree House



Take the path past St Mary's Church



Take the path past St Mary's Church



When you reach the end of the footpath, turn left (Crescent Road).



When you reach the wide road (Church Road again), turn right

After a double bend, look out for Etloe House. Marsh Lane is a turning on the left.



Buses 58 and 158 go along Church Road Or take Walk E to Orient Way and Ruckholt Road (see separate leaflet).
